Dr. Nigel Fairley and Dr. Daphne Fairley will visit with us during the noon hour regarding their Forage Crops research programs and show us some of their field plots. Please bring your own lunch. Beverages will be provided courtesy of the Research Station.
2:15 pm	Eric Hodges Feedlot at Albright. Grain handling facility and silage system, plus Eric will tell us about his cattle feedlot management program.
3:30 pm	Keith Weaver and Sons Ranch on One Island Lake Road. Keith will show us his very unique haying system and tell about his beef cattle cross breeding system.
5:15 pm	Horst David's Intensive Managed Rotational Grazing Programs, Upper Tate Creek Road. Come and see the pasture management programs you have heard about where a large number of cattle are grazed on small fields and moved in quick rotation. A portable cattle handling system sponsored by Keddies of Grand Prairie will be set up here.
7:00 pm	Bob and Joan Tubb of Tyne Cara Farms, Upper Tate Creek Road. Ford-New Holland Haying Demonstration. The newest and most up to date haying equipment will be provided by Kenver Equipment of Dawson Creek. Bob will also tell us about his high yielding winter production program.
