In 1998, a comprehensive work plan was developed that defined a number of forage opportunities. This vision was updated in 2000 and provides the context for our current projects.

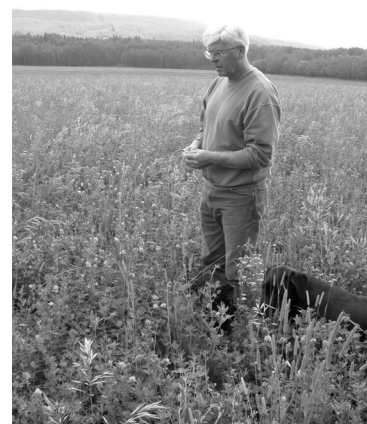
The Peace River Forage Association of BC began with a dozen committed individuals with a goal, now exceeded, of 100 producer members. Current membership is 150.

The 2004 PRFA of BC Board includes 9 directors, with 6 committee chairs. We have 10 advisors from PFRA, Kiwanis Enterprise Center, WFBG, Agri-Businesses, BCMOF, BCMAFF, PRRD & AARD.

In all of our projects the PRFA of BC is supplying part of the cash funding plus substantial in-kind contributions.

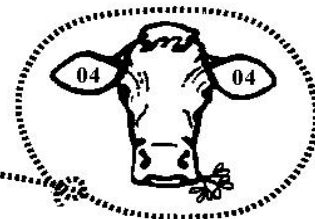

**R & D Activities of Peace River Forage Association of BC in 2004****Soil & Nutrient Management Projects (SCCC GHGMP)**

This project empowers us to demonstrate beneficial management practices in our region and organize extension activities to share the results. We are in year 3 of a 4 year project.

We have leased the Flexicoil zero till drill for 3 years to enable producers to experiment with direct seeding forages.

**Objectives:**

- ⇒ Work with the BC Taking Charge Team to organize GHGMP soil and nutrient management demos
- ⇒ Provide coordination of demos about climate change beneficial management practices (BMPs)
- ⇒ Organize a package of awareness activities related to climate change BMPs, including field days, tours, seminars, workshops and publications

**Types of BMPs Demonstrated:**

1. Direct Seeding Forages (7 plots)
2. Nutrient & Manure Management with Forages (3 plots)
3. Nutrient NH<sub>3</sub> Management with Grain, Oilseed & Forages (5 plots)

**Funding Partners:** Soil Conservation Council of Canada GHGMP, Agriculture & Agri Food Canada, Ducks Unlimited, Abbotsford Soil Conservation Assoc, Peace River Soil Conservation Assoc, Norwest Labs, Rolla Agricultural Services, Peace Tractor & Prairie Seeds.

**Livestock Management Projects (CCA GHGMP)****Objectives:**

- ⇒ Demonstrate how enhancing pastures and grazing management systems can improve productivity, profitability and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- ⇒ Compliment forage nutrient management project's activities by enabling linkages to animal feed quality and yield monitoring in terms of animal weight gain.
- ⇒ Implement a package of extension activities to share information about the mitigation of greenhouse gas emissions through good management practices in beef production systems.

**Types of BMPs Demonstrated:**

1. Feeding Strategies Courses & Feed Quality Demos (12 cooperators)
2. Grazing Management Demos (6 plots)

**In Progress:**

There are two feeding courses in progress. We are investigating setting up a grazing mentorship program. We are also setting up more demonstrations of extending the grazing season.

**Funding Partners:** Canadian Cattlemen's Association GHGMP, Beef Cattle Industry Development Fund, Norwest Labs, Northern Lights College, PRRD, Ducks Unlimited & Western Forage Beef Group.

## Wildlife Policy Committee

### Objectives:

- ⇒ Inform the public of the continuing involvement of ranchers and farmers in feeding resident wildlife on private land through out the year.
- ⇒ Clarify who is accountable for wildlife activity on private land.
- ⇒ Continue towards developing policy to deal with wildlife/ agricultural conflicts.
- ⇒ Educate the public about the positive relationship that ranchers and farmers have with wildlife.

### Progress to date:

A letter was sent to the provincial Agriculture Wildlife Advisory Committee requesting a review of policies. This request has been granted and the review will take place early in the new year. We will be looking for producer input.

**Funding Partners:** Peace River Regional District, BC Green Fund.

## Services Provided To Members

**Nose Pumps:** Contact: Glenn Hogberg (250) 843 7653. There are 3 nose pumps (Eider, Lister and Aquamat) available from PRFA of BC. If you are interested in trying out any of these out for a season contact Glenn for more details.

**AerWay:** Contact Chuck Sutherland (250) 780 2221. The 12' AerWay aerator with chain harrows and cement weights is available for rent. The current rates are \$2.50/ac for members and \$3.00/ac new members. Renters are responsible for transport from last location unless otherwise negotiated.

### Wire Spooler:

### 20' Flexicoil 8000 Air Drill:

### 43' Dutch Anhydrous Applicator:

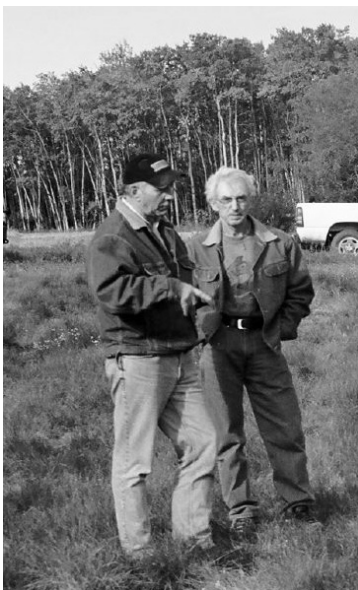
