RNC Silage Field Day at Tomslake a Huge Success

Between 100 - 150 people attended the July Silage Field Day at the Farm of Ernie and Sybil Pilz in Tomslake. John Deere Green was on full display there as RNC Sales of Dawson Creek provided the tractor power, the silage cutter, the mower conditioner, the hay rake and the big baler to assist the Pilz's in the demonstration. Ernie had recently purchased an Agri Pac chopped silage bagging system from Alberta Ag Industries in Westlock and the purpose of the field day was to demonstrate this new system of putting up silage. Those in attendance were suitably impressed by this silage harvesting and bagging system.

A silage bale bagging system, RamPak/Hurst was also demonstrated with mixed results.

RNC Sales also sponsored a tasty lunch for those in attendance at the field day.

Tube O Lator Bale Bagging Demos Held at Four Locations

Late August and early September saw silage bale bagging demonstrations conducted at the following locations: Carl Rose, Groundbirch; Jerry Kruezinger, Kreuzinger Dairy Farm, Tomslake; Chris Lefferson, Gundy.

Approximately 500 tonnes of silage were put up using a 640 New Holland Silage Special Hay Baler provided by Kenver Equipment of Dawson Creek. An 80 - 85 horse power tractor with Front Wheel ssist satisfactory as the power unit to make the 1500 pound bales.

Three locations were harvesting second cut alfalfa and one oats green feed. Two locations had the baler just a few hours behind the haybine doing this cutting whilst the other two cut one day and baled the next.


The 640 Silage Special is build sturdier than regular belt balers to handle the extra weight of the wet hay and also has special equipment to clear the wet material off the belts to ensure continuous, uninterrupted baling.

Regular belt balers usually clog up with wet hay after 25 - 35 bales are made and then a lengthy down time is involved to become operational again.
