Cattle Industry Development Council and Prairie Farm Rehabilitation Administration Assisting with Forage Projects

Quite a few worthwhile forage projects have been identified by the R & D Committee and Association Directors in the past 12 months. Your Association has recently received funding for two important projects in this group.

The Livestock Watering Demonstration in Partnership with the PFRA.

The idea is to promote the development of sustainable watering systems in the B.C. Peace River Country. We anticipate that a result of this multiyear demonstration that we will be able to show people how to economically improve both water ality to livestock and distribution of their livestock over the entire grazing unit.

The initial amount budgeted by the PFRA for these projects has been \$5,000 with these monies to go towards capital purchases of the following items:

- 1. Nose Pumps (Lister, Eider, Aquamat) comparison at Hogberg Ranch, Progress.
- 2. Breeze 1 Windmill with pump; 1200 gallon water storage tank and accessories at Tyne Cara Farm in the Tomslake area in association with an intensive management and controlled grazing program.
- 3. Nilex Geogrid for access ramps in dugouts in two locations: Benwym Farms, Progress and Keystone Ranch, Tomslake.
- 4. The BCMAFF Solar Water System will also undergo the necessary maintenance and be utilized at Keystone Ranch.

It is also hoped to include in the near future another location into this project with the assistance of the CIDC and the PFRA, an intensive management and controlled grazing program with a solar watering system at 5 Lazy B Limousin at Taylor.

Mechanical Renovation of Forage Stands in the B.C. Peace in Partnership with the CIDC.

Two sites will be used. Tate Creek Ranch at Tomslake and the Kiskatinaw River Ranch in Sunrise Valley. The objective is to find a more economical way (a once over mechanical operation) to renovate older pasture and haylands compared to a conventional tillage program which may involve six or more separate field operations.

Two machines pulled by farm tractors will be compared: The Aerway Land Renovator and the Dika Land Renovator, each with chain harrows pulled behind. Some of the plots will have fertilizer and forage seed applied. The project is being funded by cash and in kind contributions from the Association of \$9,960 plus \$9,510 from the CIDC over a two year period.

We are also looking forward to substantial assistance from Duane McCartney, Research Scientist with the Western Forage 1 Beef Group at Lacombe Research Station as we expect our local renovation project to become a part of a larger project involving Saskatchewan and Alberta sites. - ✓ Our 1996 Rimbey, Alberta Summer Tour Video was completed and distributed "Intensive Management and Controlled Grazing". Copies are available for \$20.00 each if you want one.
- Six winter forage club meetings were held and various members hosted. Attendance was the desirable 10-1 5 people each time and made for some lively discussions. Thank you to those who hosted and for helping make these important winter meetings a success.
- ✓ Quite a lot of time was spent getting our **R** and **D** projects organized into a format to be submitted for funding. A special thank you to Jim Letersky, Coordinator, PRASPS for helping us out substantially here.
- ✓ A Wildlife Policy Discussion Paper was put together as we proceed towards developing recommendations for an effective wildlife management policy in N.E. British Columbia. Contact Burnem Grant at (250) 786-5566 if you are interested in information on this important subject.
